Certains sont O+, d'autres AB-, Martin et Jean-Pierre sont PB+.

Martin Tousignant et Jean-Pierre de Beaumont jouent au pickleball aussi souvent qu'ils le peuvent depuis 5 ans. Vous avez peut-être vu l'un d'entre eux dans un tournoi de pickleball de la capitale nationale ou aux Championnats québécois à Trois-Rivières (argent) ou aux Championnats nationaux canadiens à Kingston (or).

Mais le Pickleball n'est pas la seule chose qu'ils avaient en commun. Depuis qu'ils ont atteint l'âge de 18-19 ans, ils donnent aussi du sang aussi souvent qu'ils le peuvent.

Martin avait 19 ans la première fois qu'il a donné son sang. C'était dans une clinique mobile qui s'était arrêtée dans un centre commercial de Rouyn-Noranda, sa région natale. Jean-Pierre a été invité, à 18 ans, par son père, à l'accompagner à une collecte de sang chez les Chevaliers de Colomb, Conseil # 6006. Il a vite compris que dans 25 ans, il pourrait devenir le plus jeune Canadien à atteindre 100 dons.


Martin a atteint le cap des 100 dons de sang à l'âge de 47 ans et, depuis, il a donné du plasma plus de 200 fois, pour un total de plus de 300 dons. Jean-Pierre a atteint le cap des 100 dons de sang à 44 ans et des 150 dons à 57 ans. Depuis, il a donné des plaquettes et du plasma plus de 50 fois, pour un total de plus de 200 dons.

Jean-Pierre a eu un autre rêve : un triathlon du sang, en donnant son sang sur 5 continents, dans 10 pays, pour un total de 250 fois. À ce jour, en 47 ans, il a donné son sang 213 fois sur 4 continents, dans 8 pays - le Canada et les États-Unis (Amérique du Nord), la France, l'Espagne, l'Autriche et le Portugal (Europe), le Brésil (Amérique du Sud) et la Tunisie (Afrique) - et ca se poursuit.

"Il est probable que vous ayez plus de chances de recevoir du sang de l'un de ces gars (si vous êtes malheureusement dans le besoin) que d'obtenir des points de leur part sur un terrain de pickleball, ha, ha, ha", Martin et Jean-Pierre.

Martin et Jean-Pierre jouaient au pickleball, ainsi qu'au golf, au curling, etc., depuis quelques années avant de se rendre compte qu'ils donnaient tous deux très régulièrement du plasma.

Peut-être y a-t-il beaucoup d'autres joueurs de pickleball qui partagent cet intérêt à donner du sang, avec des personnes qu'ils connaissent sans s'en rendre compte. Pourquoi ne pas essayer, et marquer des points?
