Roy Orbison inspired me to start writing my own songs.

Roy had an amazing unmatched vocal ability, he sings with so much passion, you can feel the heartbreak in his voice.

Roy wrote his songs his way, he was not afraid to write how he was feeling.

Running Scared, It's Over, Crying, Pretty Woman, Roy's songwriting was unique.

My late Mum bought me my first guitar, I taught myself play by watching and learning from other performers in bands.

My Goals.

I started to learn cover songs, and I tried to write my own songs. which I found was not easy, I knew in my mind and heart that I had to experience heartbreak to actually write about heartbreak, I knew I needed to love





and to be loved to write about love.

I didn't want to be a phoney song writer.

I wanted my songs I wrote to discuss themes such as heartbreak, hope, love, faith, freedom, want, need and desire.

Through my music I wanted it to be melodic & memorable, whilst employing smart devices to enhance the themes to keep the listener consistently engaged, and at the same time, to try and be different. which is not easy.

I learned to sing and to write uniquely.

My voice has got shades of Roy Orbison & Elvis Presley.

Whilst at the same time retaining a character all of my own whilst singing from the heart.

I firmly believe now that all obstacles, both good and bad, that life throws at us, are the perfect source of inspiration for a meaningful, heartfelt song.

Being unafraid to express my deeper feelings and darkest thoughts.

Yet, at the same time, being aware that songs need to be uplifting, inspirational, and fun.

Achievements and Challenges.

After 20 years of trying to become a professional entertainer, after many



failures, which I turned into learning lessons.

The need to do a boring day job, whilst keeping focused on my goals in my minds eye wasn't easy, I wanted to give up many many times.

I had an audition to be part of an entertainment team on a cruise ship and was successful.

But, my Mum sadly had a brain aneurysm, which needed 9 hours of brain surgery. Mum survived and came through this horrific ordeal, but Mum was never to be the same again after this.

Mum needed 24/7 care. I turned down my entertainer opportunity on the cruise ships to become my Mums full time carer. I have to admit it was not easy at times, I took care of Mums everyday needs.

Mum sadly over a very short time was diagnosed as a Paranoid schizophrenic, this was due to the frontal aneurysm.

Mum then slowly developed Dementia and Parkinson's and this was all within 2 years after her aneurism. But as challenging as this was, I proudly took care of her until she passed away.

Mum passed over on her birthday, and knowing my Mum that's what she planned to do.

Mums view on life was to enjoy life and live life to the full, she told me not be sad





when I am gone, as I will always be with you.

Mums passing has left a permanent hole in my heart.

Mum made me promise not to give up on my dreams and my lifelong goal of becoming a professional entertainer.

Around a year before Mum passed over, she told

me to write a song about a Gypsy Girl, which I didn't have a clue how to write.

Mum was of Gypsy heritage, and while I was sitting with her trying to write the lyrics and guitar chords, she reminisced about how she and her whole family and other Gypsy families would work in the cherry fields. When it came to the weekend they would sit down outside in front of an open fire and sing songs. The young Gypsy


Girls would tease the Gypsy Boys with their sultry body language while dancing around the camp fire teasing the boys with their sexy deep dark eyes.

I wrote Gypsy Girl, but before I could record the song, sadly,

Mum passed away.

Eventually I did record Gypsy Girl, and as I was starting to turn my life around from being an amateur to a professional entertainer, lockdown happened.

I took the lockdown time to work on my cover songs more and to also work on my original songs, I created my unique show of 1950's & 1960's songs. I had a website created.







When lockdown ended I couldn't get any work as an entertainer, my nerves were terrible, I had lost my confidence.

But all was not lost, I was contacted by a care home agent who came across my website by accident, he specialised in booking entertainers to sing at various care homes.

This became a great way for me to help get my confidence back, as I loved it, there is something magical about singing to an elderly resident in a care home who has dementia, who doesn't know what day of the week it is, but they remember the words the songs from their youth, it was great fun.

Then from this I gained my confidence and applied for an audition at BCM Entertainments ltd, owned by Mr Ray Martin.

This was November 2024, and WOW, he has made a lot of my dreams and goals come true. I have entertained on Saga Cruise Ships, performed at lots of various holiday parks, Warner hotels, and his amazing 60's weekenders. I cannot thank him enough.

Now my last goal is to be known as a singer songwriter.

I am now signed with Deborah Fennella, The Head of A&R Special Edition Records, as a charity song writer. And it gets better as I will be signing with K Dragon Records which has happened with Deborah's guidance.

So now my next chapter begins on my road to hopefully become a known singer songwriter. I don't know if this will happen, but I am going to write and perform my heart out completely.

Life is certainly for living and for learning, but most importantly I will always stay and be Humble.

To be able to perform and to lift the spirits of an audience all I can say in one word is 'HEAVEN' I am blessed.
