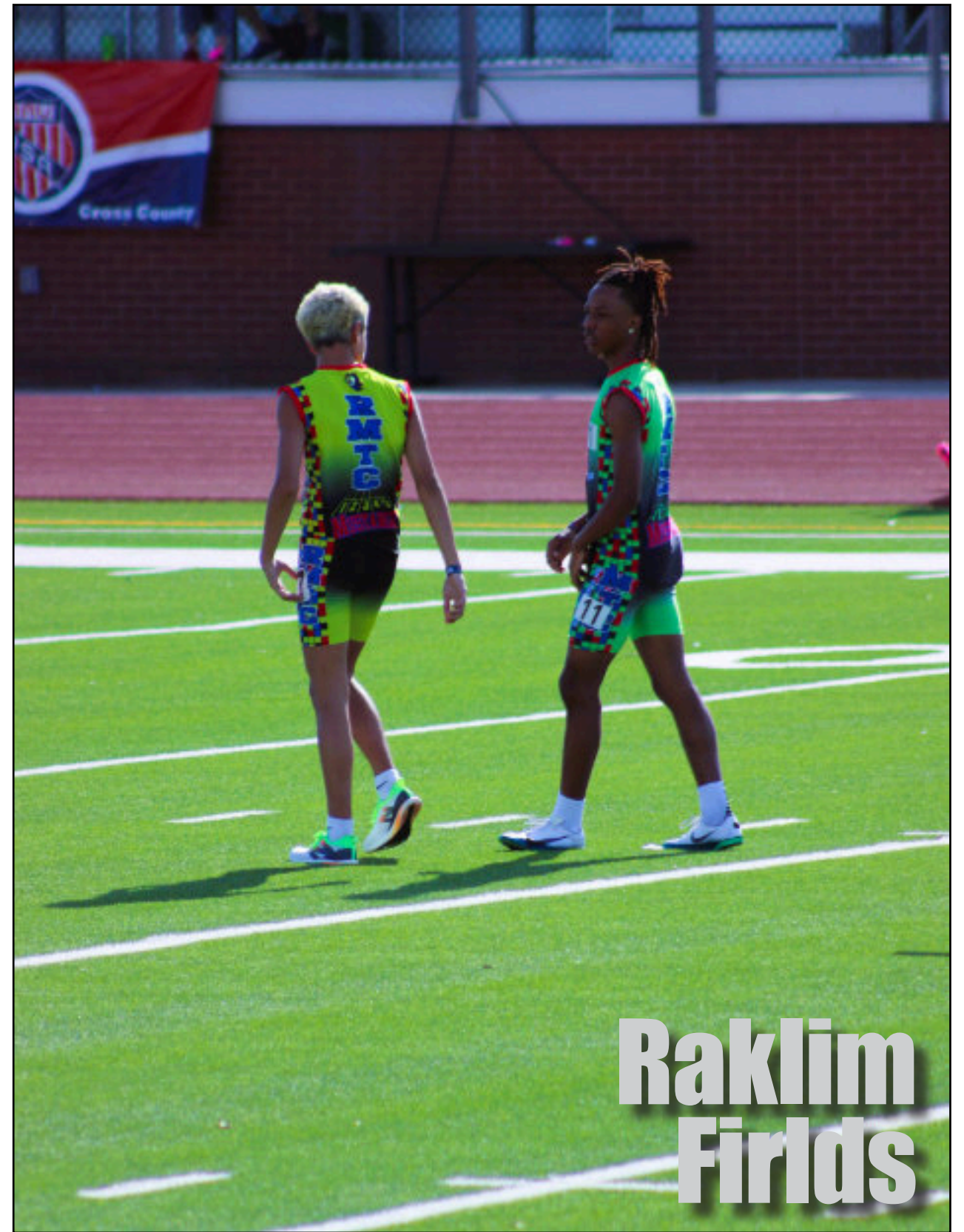
My name is Raklim Fields, and I'm a high school track athlete at North Forney High School in Texas with a vision of taking my running career to the highest level—Division I collegiate competition. Track isn't just something I do; it's a part of who I am, and every workout, every race, and every challenge is a step toward the athlete I'm working to become.

Right now, I hold the third-best 800-meter time in North Forney history, a milestone that motivates me to aim even higher. As a junior, I've already experienced some big moments: I ran a 4:28 in the 1500 meters—only the second time I had ever competed in that event—showing me that my range and potential go beyond just one race.

My sophomore year was a breakthrough season. I ran varsity, helped my school win the district championship, and proved to myself that I could compete and contribute at the highest level within our program. That year taught me that mental toughness is just as important as physical conditioning—especially when the stakes are high.

But the journey hasn't been without challenges. Like any athlete, I've faced moments where the workouts hurt, the times didn't improve as fast as I wanted, or my confidence wavered. Each setback, however, became fuel. I've learned that discipline, patience, and trust in the process are what turn good athletes into great ones.

Looking ahead, my goal is to compete at the Division I level, representing a college program that values hard work, consistency, and competitiveness. I want to keep improving my 800-meter time, expand my range in other middle-distance events, and continue setting personal and school records.

Tyrese Beals isn't just a seasonal athlete—he's in the game all year long. From the basketball courts to the football fields of Nova Scotia, Tyrese is building a name for himself as a dedicated and versatile youth athlete. Tyrese brings intensity and finesse to every play

He plays Division 1 basketball for the YMCA, showcasing his speed, skill, and court awareness. On the football side, Tyrese suits up for the Dartmouth Destroyers, where he predominately plays wide receiver but has also played slot on offence, linebacker, and safety on defence—and is now stepping into a new role as quarterback at the PeeWee level.

"I love the thrill of making a big catch, a head-top play, or breaking away for a touchdown," Tyrese says. "Playing both sides of the ball keeps me sharp and makes the game

"I play sports all year round—tackle football, flag football, and basketball," Tyrese explains. "Having the opportunity to play with other kids who play with heart and have a high drive to play their best makes me a better player." And when asked about his mindset, Tyrese sums it up with a powerful quote: "I'm just out here grinding until the lights find me."

With a strong work ethic, a love for competition, and a passion for learning new positions, Tyrese Beals is a standout youth athlete whose journey is just beginning.
