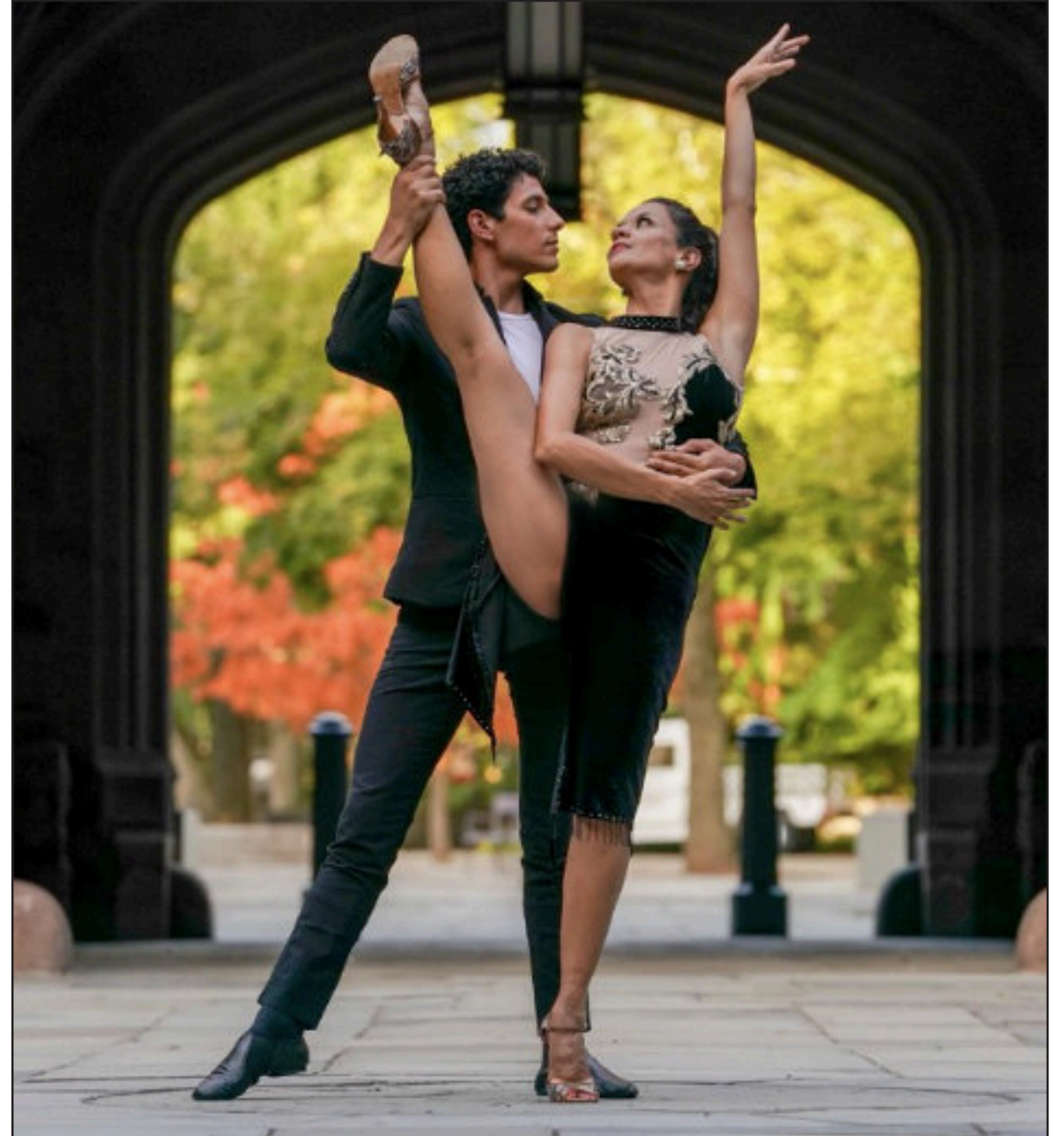
My name is Analia Farfan, I'm a dancer, choreographer and founder of the International American Ballet based in New York.

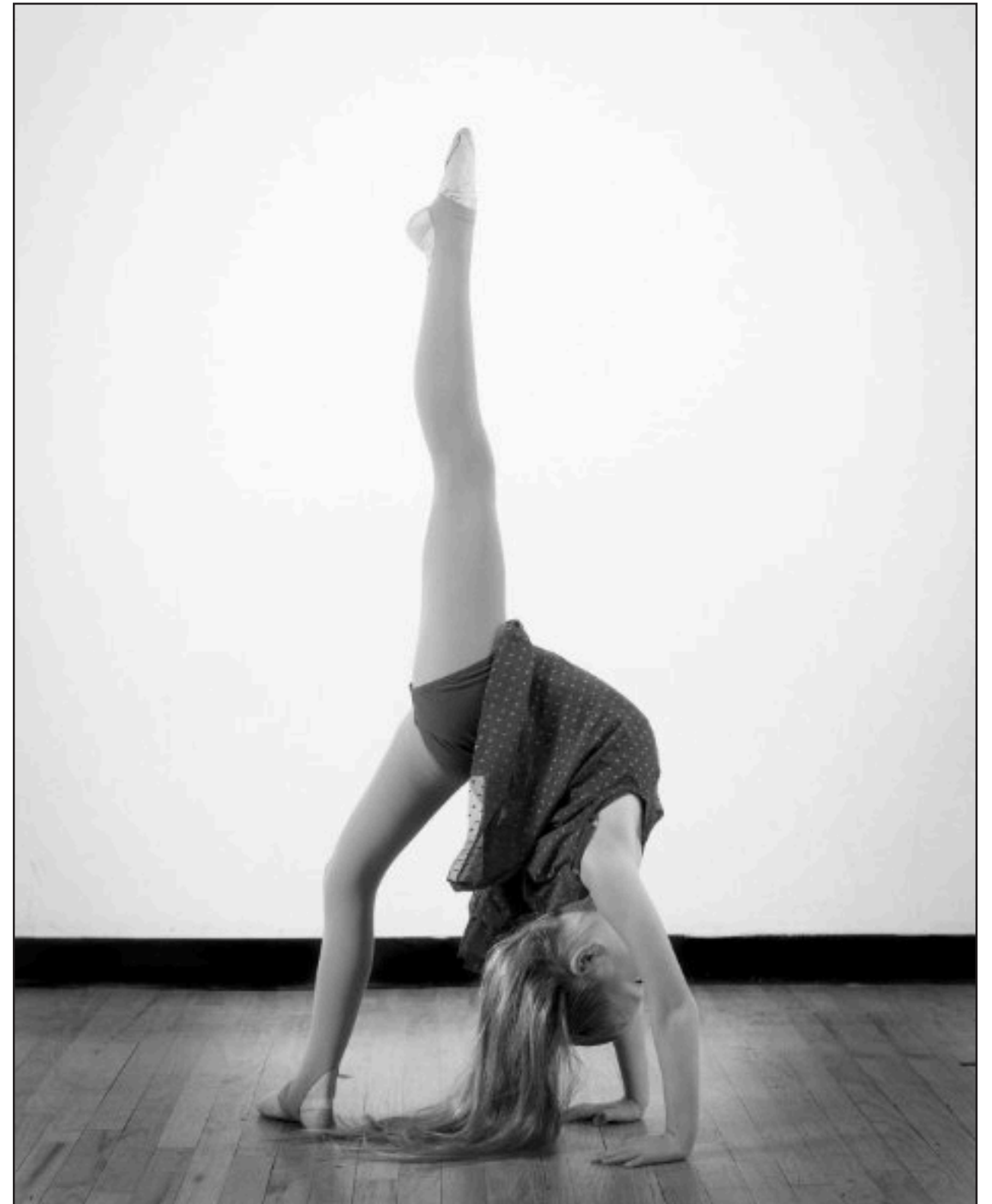
The journey has not always been easy. I have faced challenges like comparing myself to others, handling tough corrections, and feeling

Joslynn Ferreri



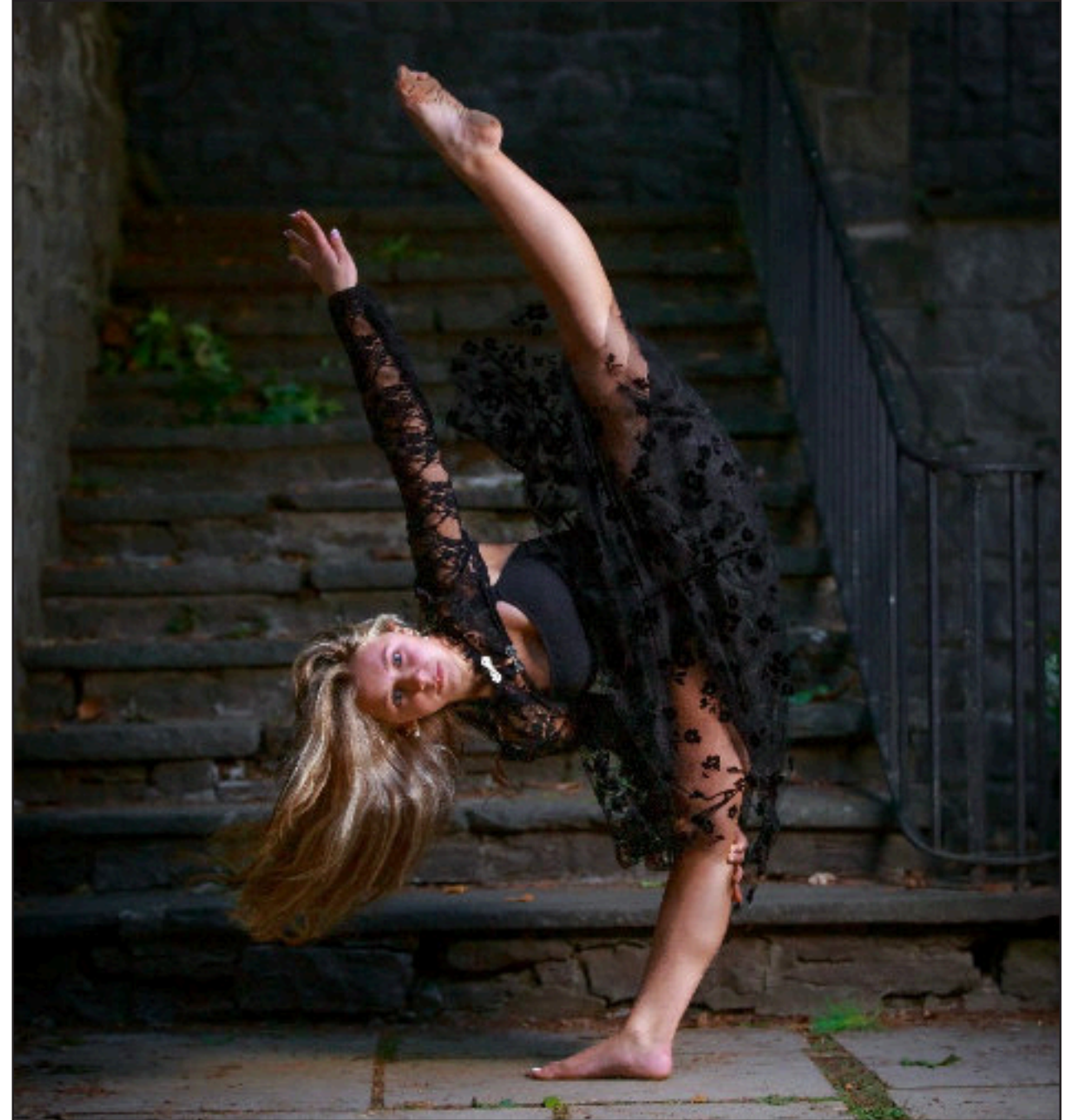

As a mom, there's nothing quite like watching your child discover the thing that makes them come alive. For my daughter Raicheal, that thing has always been dance.

At just nine years old, she's already poured herself into acro, ballet, contemporary, tap,

musical theatre, hip hop, and jazz. It's not just about learning the steps—it's about expression, connection, and the freedom to be her true self. When Raicheal dances, she tells stories without words. She shines from the inside out. And in those moments on stage, I see a confidence and joy in her that takes my breath away.

She draws deep inspiration from one of her

teachers, a woman who continues to teach and perform while facing stage IV ovarian cancer. Her strength, grace, and unwavering love for dance have shown Raicheal what it means to be resilient—to lead with heart, to keep showing up, even when life is unimaginably hard.

One of the proudest moments in Raicheal's journey came when she was accepted into the Joffrey Ballet summer intensive. She was only eight, one of the youngest to audition, and didn't know a single person in the room. But she walked in with courage and danced her heart



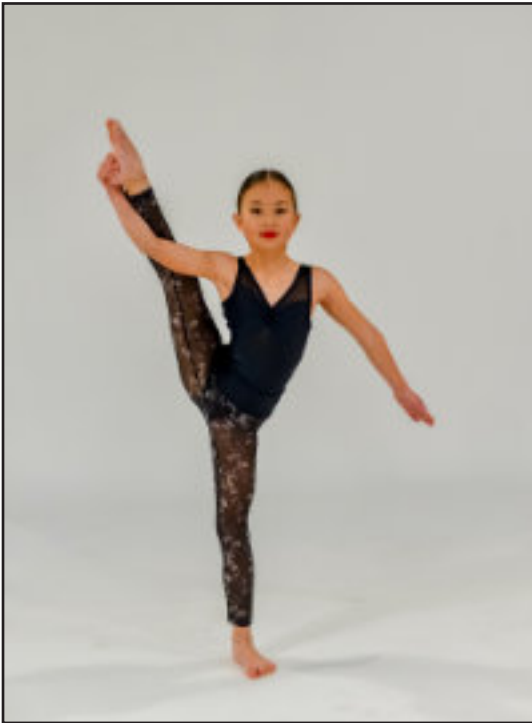

Raigan Knight



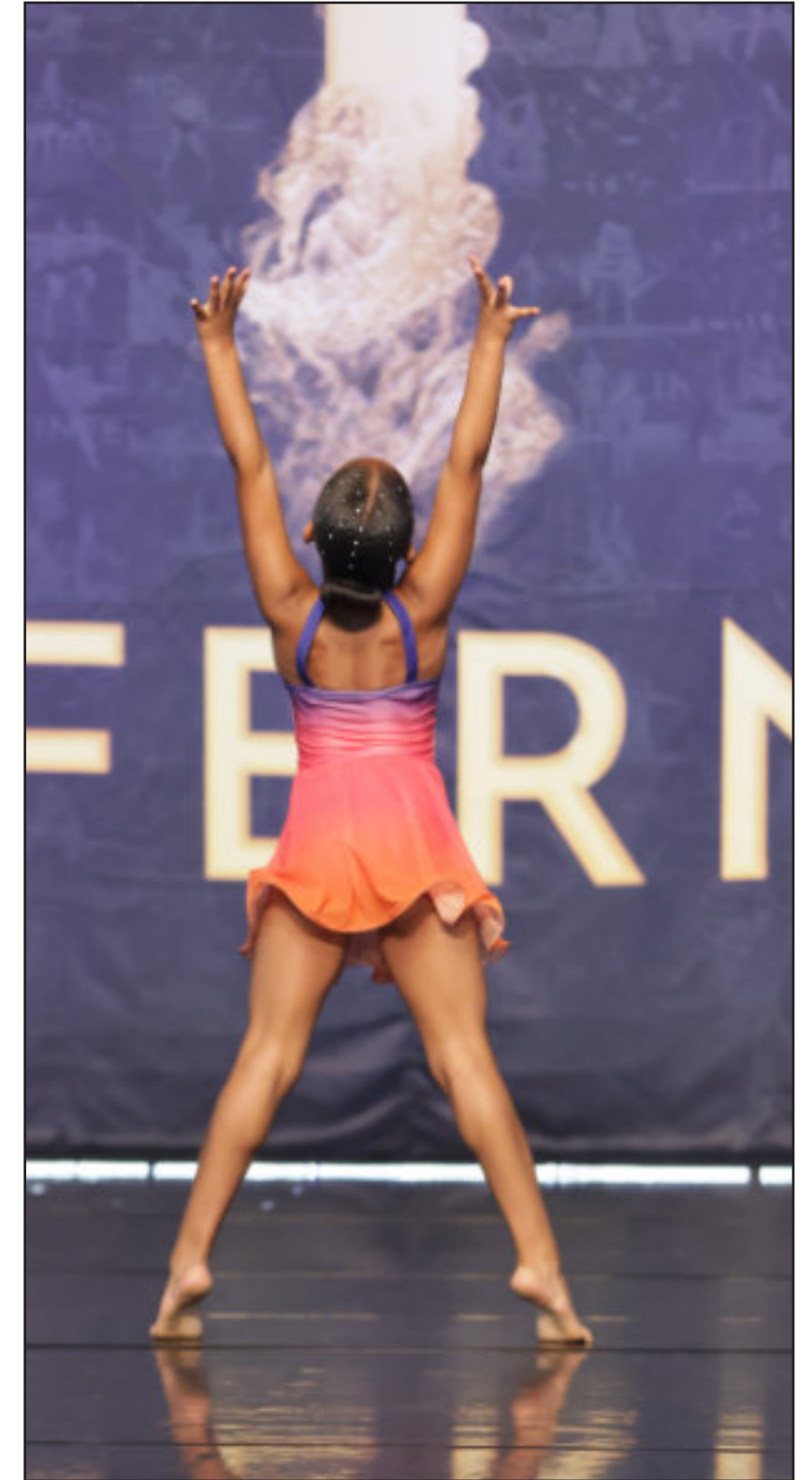

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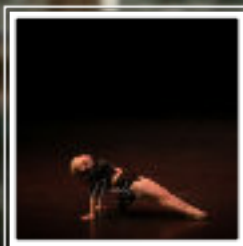
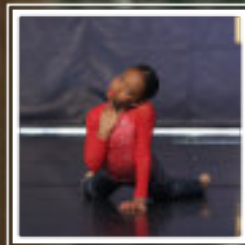
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
