



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




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









Hey hey it's ya girl Candie aka Tigerstripedbeauty.

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


true to the art was tough — but it made us stronger. Every challenge pushed me to grow not just as an artist, but as a leader.


We faced the usual struggles too — finding the right team, keeping consistency, and standing out in a crowded scene. But through it all, we staved grounded treated popular sight and kent

There were long nights, setbacks, and moments where I questioned if it would all come together. Balancing the business side while still staying


stayed grounded, treated people right, and kept our focus on quality. That's what built our name.

With nearly 40 years as a Fine Artist and over 30



Our mission is to create a high-quality, safe, and


welcoming space where every client can enjoy a one-of-a-kind tattoo experience.


For far too long, tattoo shops have carried the stigma of being part of a seedy, underground culture. We're here to change that.

Our studio is calm, clean, and inviting — a place




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
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Ink and Ambition: My Journey Through Dreams, Challenges, and Achievements in Tattooing


Ever since I was young, I've been fascinated by art — by the way a blank space can transform into something meaningful, emotional, and alive. When I turned 18, I dreamed of studying Fine Arts at a university and opening my own tattoo

studio one day. Tattooing, to me, wasn't just about ink on skin; it was about storytelling, emotion, and self-expression.

However, my parents didn't share the same vision. They believed art wasn't a "serious" path — that it was unstable and uncertain. Like many young people, I found myself torn between my dreams and my family's expectations. So, I set aside my artistic ambitions and chose to study something more "practical." I pursued a degree in the automotive field, aiming to become a car designer.

At first, it felt like the responsible choice. The

world of design still had creativity in it, but deep down, I knew something was missing. The passion, the fire — it just wasn't there. I completed my studies, proud of what I had achieved academically, but I couldn't silence the voice inside me that kept whispering about tattoos, art, and the life I had once imagined.



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







only the dream — I carry the experience, the resilience, and the story that brought me here.
